

You may have noticed that Integra Buildings' premises on Main Street have been put up for sale. The company has been based at their current factory site for the past 17 years. Starting from a few workers in 1997 producing a limited product range of pre-fabricated buildings they have grown into a multi-million pound business now employing some 80 people. They produce a wide range of products from modular sporting facilities, hospital wards and education facilities including schools and nurseries to commercial offices and construction site accommodation. However, success has brought its own problems and the constrained premises in Burstwick are hampering expansion. A new factory is needed and a site at Paull has been identified. As well as having good links to the motorway network a location at Paull will cause least disturbance for the workforce which is mainly Holderness based. To help fund the move the company proposes to apply for planning permission for a residential development of around 25 – 30 houses and have already explained their intentions to the Parish Council. The company's MD Gary Parker said "Various technical studies are currently being carried out and it is proposed to hold a public exhibition in the village once they have been completed. This will be an opportunity for local people to express their views on the proposals before an application is submitted to ERYC." Information on the date and location of the exhibition will be made available in due course.

## UPCOMING LOCAL ROAD SAFETY INITIATIVES


East Riding of Yorkshire Council propose to make a Road Traffic Regulation Order to install a 40mph speed limit zone along the B1362 in a North Westerly direction from Burstwick, for approx. 380mtrs towards Daisyhill Road. Additionally, Burstwick Parish Council have supported a ERYC assessment of a part time advisory 20mph speed limit zone outside Burstwick Community Primary School during the hours when the school starts and finishes. Any proposed work following the assessment will be added to the ERYC Forward Programme to be assessed against schemes of a similar nature during 2017 / 2018.

## LOCAL LIFESTYLE 2016 GROUP RAISES £200

2016 Lifestyle group 'Sky Touchers' raised in the region of £200 for the RNLI and Brake Charity. Youngsters Joshua Storey, Sam Sutton and Tilly Oades from Burstwick and Burton Pidsea concentrated their efforts on road safety, the green cross code and speeding.

**POWER CUT? CALL 105** | On 6th September a new national phone number '105' was launched by electricity network operators for customers to call should they need to report or get information about a power cut in their area. Key points about this service:

- Dialling 105 will put customers through to the electricity network operator who manages the cables, power lines and substations that deliver electricity into homes and businesses in their area.
- 105 is just one of the ways that customers will be able to contact their electricity network operator. They can also contact them by phone or via their website, and most network operators, including Northern Powergrid, are on social media too.
- 105 is a free service for people in England, Scotland and Wales.
- Customers can call 105 no matter who they choose to buy electricity from.
- Customers can also call 105 if they spot damage to electricity power lines and substations that could put anyone in danger. If there's a serious immediate risk, they should call the emergency services too.
